Lesson 1: Global preparations

1. Watch the video once without taking notes

3. Watch the video a third time if you didn't have all the right answers and try to understand why you answered wrong.

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Lesson 2: Prepare your tour

1. Discuss with your classmates which rooms you want to include in your guided tour. Use a big floor plan of your school and draw a red circle in all the rooms you think are important. Come up with 1-2 rooms per student.
2. Split up in four groups and assign a part of the plan to each group (4-8 rooms / group)
3. In your groups
 - a. discuss which elements (photos, videos, text boxes...) you need in each room, so visitors get all the information they need. Do not forget that visitors are not French / German and that there are certain things you may have to explain to them.
 - b. Decide who is going to be responsible for the treasure hunt (1 student / group)

4. Split up

Treasure hunt delegates

- a. Meet with the treasure hunt delegates of the other groups
- b. Decide in which room you want to hide the treasure and what it will be
- c. The name of the room where the treasure will be hidden will be made up of the letters you hide as clues in different rooms. So, if you hide the treasure in the chemistry lab, the letters C H E M I S T R Y L A B must be hidden in different rooms.
- d. Decide where you will hide your clues and who will hide which letter(s). You should put a little audio recording in these rooms that help you find the clue (for example: "Look for the clue next to the window. It is the second letter of the solution").
- e. Put green boxes in the designated rooms on the school's floor plan.
- f. Fill out the project plan
- g. Come up with an oral introduction to your treasure hunt (write it down first 😊) that will be welcoming the visitors in the first scene

Individual tour groups

- a. split up in pairs and assign to each pair an equal number of rooms they will be responsible for.
- b. Work with your partner and make a list of the elements you have to create. Then decide who is responsible for which room(s).
- c. Fill out the individual project plan (including a drawing)
- d. Write a short text in English about the room(s) you were assigned. Give each other feedback before handing in your texts.

Treasure hunt delegates + tour group

1. Produce the multimedia content / the clues you need and check the elements off the group plan and the project plans
2. Record your descriptions of the rooms / the oral clues individually as MP3 files.
3. Upload the content your created to the OneDrive (1 folder per room)

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4 & 5: Create your virtual tour

Treasure hunt delegates

1. Go back to your treasure hunt group
2. Check if you have all the elements you need and if everyone knows where to hide their clues.
3. Go back to your group and integrate the clues and letters (if necessary) in the scenes. Also hide the treasure. Help your group members to create their part of the tour.

Tour group

1. Create your Holobuilder scene(s)
2. Work together with your treasure hunt delegates and integrate the clues and letters (if necessary) in the scenes together
3. Once you have finished a room, put a green checkmark ✓ in the red circle on the plan of the school and check the boxes in red

Lessons 6 & 7: Interviews

Now that you have created a virtual tour of your school for your French/German partners, we will add some interviews to your virtual tour.

Who do you think would have interesting things to say about your school? Maybe your principal? The secretaries? The teacher who is responsible for the cover plan? Who else?

1. **Make a list** of potential interviewees with your class.
2. **Assign** each interviewee to two students.
3. Work in pairs:
 - a. **Check back** with the person you want to interview if they accept to be interviewed. **Tell** them about the project and **ask** if it is okay for them that the interview will be added to your virtual school tour online.
 - b. **Come up with interview questions** that will be interesting for your partners.
 - c. **Decide** where you want to film the interview. The place you will use should be part of the virtual school tour so it can be added to that scene.
 - d. Now **plan** your interview.

Since your partners do not understand your language but the interviewees will not necessarily speak English, you will be both **interviewer and mediator**. That means that once you have asked a question and the interviewee has answered it in your language, you will turn around to the camera and translate what they said into English (in reported speech but not a word-by-word translation).

The interview should be no longer than 2 Minutes including mediation.
 - e. **Practice** the interview with your partner.
 - f. **Record** the interview with an app that creates mp4-files.
 - g. If necessary, **cut out** the parts you don't want to keep.
 - h. **Save** the interview to the OneDrive.
 - i. **Add** your interview to the Holobuilder scene where it belongs.

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Lessons 8 & 9: Review the tours of our partners and give feedback

1. Watch the tour of your partners together and find the treasure.
2. Write a short feedback for one or two rooms. Share the work so every room gets feedback. Say why you like the room and come up with one question.
